Morning Music takes place every Tuesday and Thursday morning from 10 to 11 a.m., June to August, in McGinley Pavilion. On Tuesday mornings, attendees will enjoy a master performance on one of the nation's few hand-played carillons, taking in the majestic sound of the 48-bell Theodore C. Butz Memorial Carillon on Evening Island. Since 1986, the carillon has remained both a noted landmark and a source of remarkable music at the Garden. On Thursday mornings, the program features a wide variety of music, ranging from string quartets to harp duos and jazz trios, Brazilian guitar, and more.
